The Three Star Scholarship

Initially created in 2013 as the Lt. General John "Glad" Castellaw Scholarship, this award is granted to a U.S. veteran enrolling or enrolled in a UT Martin campus or online graduate program. The scholarship carries an amount of \$500 and there can be multiple recipients, resources permitting.

The Honorees



John "Glad" Castellaw, of Alamo, Tennessee, graduated from the University of Tennessee at Martin in 1972 with a degree in agriculture and a commission in the Marines. His 36-year military career includes humanitarian and security operations around the world, as well as a stint as chief of staff of the U.S. Central Command at the height of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. Castellaw is a recognized national security expert who serves on the boards of directors of the Nuclear Security Working Group, the Iran Futures Group and the American Security Project. His military honors include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal and the Defense Superior Service Medal.



Robert Hinson received a Bachelor of Science in education from the University of Tennessee at Martin in 1970. He later continued his education at Arkansas State University and the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and graduated from the Squadron Officer School, the Air Command and Staff College, and the National War College. Hinson is a command pilot with more than 3,000 flying hours, primarily in bomber aircraft, and has commanded a variety of unit types. He served as deputy commander in chief at U.S. Strategic Command prior to assuming his current position as vice commander of Air Force Space Command at Peterson Air Force Base in Colorado. His military honors include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, the Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit and the Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters.



Dennis Cavin, of Martin, Tennessee, received his Bachelor of Science in agriculture from the University of Tennessee at Martin in 1970. He is also a graduate of the Industrial College Armed Forces and earned a graduate degree from Webster University in 1982. Gavin received his commission in the U.S. Army in 1970 and advanced through the ranks to Lt. General as a career air defense artillery officer. He served as deputy commanding general and commanding general of the U.S. Army Air Defense Artillery Center at Ft. Bliss, Texas, and has held posts in Washington, D.C. Gavin currently runs a non-profit organization called the Fallen Soldiers March. His military honors include the Decorated Defense Superior Service medal, the Legion of Merit with three oak leaf clusters and the Meritorious Service medal with oak cluster.
