Hansung International Summer School

Hansung University offers a 4-week summer program, which combines Korean Studies and Korean Language courses. (All instruction is in English.) This program also includes about 30 various activities and field trips. Upon completion of the program, students receive from Hansung University an official certificate of completion of the courses "Special Topics in Asian Studies: Introduction to Korea and its Culture" and "Basic Korean Language." Hansung University

Hansung University is located in the historic northern district of Seoul. Founded in 1945, the University presently serves approximately 6,700 undergraduate students and 840 graduate students enrolled in 4 colleges (College of Arts, College of Engineering, College of Social Science and College of Humanities). The partnership between Hansung University and UTM has been reestablished recently.

Full Scholarship for the UTM Students

The annual number of UTM students receiving the full scholarship for this program depends on the terms of agreement on the exchange program between UTM and Hansung students. For the year 2016, Hansung University has agreed to offer **three** UTM students a full scholarship (i.e. waiving tuition and all

the fees related to accommodation, meals, and field trips, which amount to 2,700 dollars in total). Receiving a full scholarship, students have to cover their airfare and personal expenditures only.

Application

Students interested in this program should turn in a copy of cover letter to Dr. Hyungju Hur (hhur1@utm.edu) by **February 19th, 2016**. (Please, email a copy of cover letter as an attached file.)

The cover letter must include

1. Name, UTM ID#, major, and school year
2. Why the applicant wants to attend this program
3. How this program will help the applicant's major, future career, or life
4. Applicant's participation in activities related to Korea (if any)
5. Current G.P.A.

David Coffey, the head of the Department of History and Philosophy, and Hyungju Hur, assistant professor of the department, will be in charge of the process of selecting candidates for the full scholarship. There might be additional interviews for the final decision. The decision will be made, and conveyed to Hansung University, by the end of February, 2016.
